**BRAZIL** - Greetings from the Southern Hemisphere! 2022 starts off with great news from ISO. The Brazil Bureau is proud to announce that after the adoption of ISO 18841:2018 – Interpreting Services -General Requirements and Recommendations by the Brazilian

Standardization Association (ABNT), under AIIC's leadership, the group of members from local associations and the Academia is ready to start working on the adoption of ISO 22155: 2022 – Conference Interpreting – Requirements and recommendations. Congratulations for their dedication and effort! This is only one of the many initiatives developed locally with the support of AIIC volunteers. **GERMANY** - On January 7th, 2022, Dr. Margarete Mehdorn received the French order of merit "Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Mérite" for her achievements in furthering Franco-German friendship. ## **NEWS FROM THE GROUPS**

AIIC Training and Professional Development (ATPD) has been through a period of transition over the past 18 months, with a new coordinator (Michelle Hof) and a number of new members joining the group. In that period, much of the group's efforts have been focused on keeping up the momentum in our training activities while adapting to new realities under the Covid-19 pandemic. Now, with the group's membership settled for the medium term, we plan to direct our energies toward finding new and effective ways to contribute to the profession through training while keeping up our existing projects.

New initiatives will include improving communications between ATPD and AIIC's other networks, groups and committees and with the regions. We are also looking at improving our outreach to members and to the broader conference interpreting training community by expanding our ATPD mailing lists to include a newsletter. Novel training formats will also be explored as we seek to increase the impact of our training efforts. We intend to find ways to implement our sponsorship program, as outlined in the ATPD budget, despite ongoing travel restrictions due to Covid-19.

In terms of existing projects, we will continue to work on ensuring that ATPD's presence on aiic.org is what it should be, helping the Executive Secretary and his staff optimize AIIC's event registration, payment and certificate issuing processes, maintaining the <u>Schools Directory</u> and the list of trainers, and – of course – providing quality Training of Trainers and CPD opportunities for the conference interpreting community.

...to the new Advisory Board, representing the regions and groups inside AIIC. They will be ably guided by the members of the Steering Committee: Phil Smith (Switzerland), Camille Mercier-Sanders (France), Felix Ordeig (Spain) and Andrew Constable (TFDI).









The Technical and Health Committee (THC) is currently running several testing and research projects aimed at testing ISO compliance of cloud-based videoconferencing systems and of microphones used by speakers in RSI. RSI and non-RSI related health issues are also being explored.

A database of existing and ongoing scientific research and medical literature on topics directly or indirectly related to interpreters' health will be set-up in the upcoming months. The THC welcomes input from all AIIC members.

The THC is also planning to collect self-reported symptoms of negative health impacts (including a variety of auditory complaints such as tinnitus and hyperacusis, and other medical complaints including dizziness, nausea, confusion, mental fog, insomnia, headaches, concentration difficulties, optic nerve sensitivity) among interpreters that started or worsened over the last 2 years which they would attribute to RSI assignments.

Evidence-based findings will help us designing a research project on interpreters' health in DI configurations that will be used to underpin future guidelines and recommendations.
