2022 ASSEMBLY

Work in progress... At its meeting on 29th April, ExCo confirmed that the AIIC Assembly, postponed from January 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, would be held from 13-16 January 2022. That much is for sure. Given the on-going uncertainty regarding travel restrictions and the holding of large gatherings, however, it's still too early to make the call on what form the Assembly will take and ExCo's ear remains firmly to the ground. Arrangements for the Assembly are a matter of necessity, not preference, with any decision being dictated by the prevailing global health situation and the legal provisions of the AIIC texts, not to mention the need to comply with French law.
